An update of degree requirements was implemented in Fall 2016. All courses currently required for the degree have been differently, and prerequisites for upper division requirements are built into the degree plan as foundational coaccentric petitions for INTL students are reviewed by faculty with expertise in relevant content areas before the petitions are reviewed by the chair of the INTL program. leadership and coordination of the program. Given the current fiscal environment limiting new hires, in the least, continued support in the form of course/s release fo**Cthæ**ir is highly advisable.

Challenges:

- Sustaining and rewarding the volunteerism of the INTL factualty offer their classes, their assessment, their advising, and their curriculum building expertise to the INTL program in addition to their many responsibilities in their home departments.
- Budget budgetconstraints have little direct impact on the INTL program since it is already efficient and low
 cost (see Strengths above). However, the budget canseadorder effects ince faculty generally must
 answer first to the needs and priorities of their home departments, which in many cases are understaffed
 due to attrition. We have built flexibility into the INTL curriculum, but unanticipated changes to course
 offerings couldeave holes in the program. This requires continuing coordination among the INTL director,
 INTLserving faculty, and CAS administration.
