Faculty of violence are limited primarily to “siloe” responses by sexual assault, domestic violence abuse programs. These responses limit the ability of victims who do not “meet program” from receiving a medical forensic examination (MFE) under the auspices of a standard such as SART. Limits including time from the event, lack of trained SAFE/SANE, lack of elders, and inability to recognize victimization in various health care settings, are also face victims from receiving evaluation, investigation, prosecution, and ultimately, justice.

Recognition of the gaps in training for health care professionals (RN, NP, PA, MD) led to the development of generalist forensic medical training utilizing a hybrid educational model incorporating online modules with a three-day in-person course totaling approximately 50 hours.
